It was hot! Too hot for many (me included!) and that meant the long course in particular was a little too long. Sorry for that. And sorry for the mass of nettles and tall vegetation to a couple of controls. When I planned the courses a couple of months ago those areas were runnable semi open, so it was a bit of a shock to see waist high nettles last night. With that and my like of legs where you have to make a choice as to which way to run to the next control, it made the course, which had a straight line distance of 7.3km, more like 11km, (and that was if you went straight to each control without any errors!). That is a little long. So, apologies to those of you who were out for an inordinate amount of time. At least the weather was nice!

Short course runners fared a little better – I got that length right at least! I hope you enjoyed the different parts of the park – the formal urban park at the start/finish – the more rough open area once you got over the stream, and then the blocks of woodland in Pages Wood. You would have seen a couple of the wooden sculptures as you ran to the controls.

For those new to orienteering, I hope you enjoyed the format of making your own way round courses in an area you have no doubt run a lot on in the past. There are lots more opportunities to experience orienteering if you enjoyed it! There is a race at Hornchurch country park this Sunday, with a couple of easier courses. Then, the next of this series in Colchester in a couple of weeks, a bit closer in Thorndon Park in a month, and then we have a Twilight series of events after the summer holidays, in South Ockendon, South Woodham Ferrers and Brentwood.
