DIRECTIONS:

NB. CHANGE OF CAR PARK (as of 21/10/2017)

<u>From M25 Junction 30</u>: Head east along the A13 towards Southend for 10 miles. Take the slip-road at the Five Bells interchange/junction with A176 & B1420. 4th exit at first roundabout onto A176; 2nd exit at second roundabout back towards the M25; 1st exit at 3rd roundabout onto the B1420. After nearly 1 mile, turn right at the next roundabout onto One Tree Hill. After 200m you should cross over the A13. The car park is a further 300m on the left. Limited car parking – please share if possible. Mini-buses should park on the hard-standing in the first section of the car park.

Nearest railway station is Basildon about 2.5k from the car park.

CAR PARK:

At the bottom car park in One Tree Hill, near Basildon, Essex, grid ref: <u>TQ697858</u>, nearest postcode is <u>SS17 9NH</u>. It is not recommended to approach via Dry Street. NB Dry Street cannot be accessed from the A176 Nethermayne.

FACILITIES:

Toilets 300m uphill from the centre of the car park, please give way to competitors on their course. Dogs welcome if under control.

Orange	3.0k	70m	12	Moderate-competent juniors/adult improvers
Light Green	3.4k	90m	18	Fairly hard-experienced juniors/competent adults
Short Green	3.1k	85m	17	Hard-experienced orienteers
Green	4.6k	125m	16	Hard-experienced orienteers
Blue	6.7k	210m	18	Hard-experienced orienteers
Brown	9.1k	300m	21	Hard-experienced orienteers

There is a course suitable for all abilities. Help available for beginners.

MAP:

Resurveyed and drawn to **ISOM 2017** standard by Tom Edelsten, autumn 2017. White, Yellow. Orange. Light Green and Short Green courses have maps at 1:5000 of the One Tree Hill area. Green, Blue and Brown have 1:10000 maps.

NOTE: The Brown course has road crossings so only people over 16 may run that course.

NOTE: For Light Green only, control 138 is visited twice!

Course overprint will be to ISOM 2000 as new symbol sets are not yet available/tested.

<u>DESCRIPTIONS</u> White and Yellow courses have written control descriptions printed on the maps. All other

courses, including Orange have pictorial descriptions printed on the maps. Loose

descriptions are available at Registration, for Orange these will be written/text descriptions

otherwise the loose descriptions will be the same type as printed on the maps.

NOTE, for Light Green and Short Green the descriptions are split on the map print.

TERRAIN The terrain includes mature woodland and open areas with significant hills, as you can see

from the climb shown above.

Come and experience some Essex contours!

TIMES: Registration 10:00 am to 12:00 noon.

Starts 10:30 am to 12:30 pm.

Courses close 2:30 pm.

Start 150m and finish 50m from the car park. Registration will be adjacent to the car park,

look for the HAVOC banner

ENTRY FEES: Seniors: £7; non-British Orienteering members: £9

Juniors (under 21): £3.

Families/groups/pairs as for Seniors but pick up one map only please.

Electronic punching will be used; SI-card hire 50p.

Fees include all national, regional and local access levies and car parking.

FIRST AID: A first aid kit will be available at Download. A club first aider will be available if

required. The nearest A&E is at Basildon University Hospital, SS16 5NL – off the A176 Nethermayne. **Note** the direct route via Dry Street is closed, you will need to take the

southerly route via the B1420. The organiser has a location map.
